



Community Mobilization and Financial Inclusion through Digital Economy

IDF has promoted self-sustaining SHGs of women and JLGs of men at grass roots and Producer Groups of farm families at clusters to sustain and graduate the developmental initiatives into ongoing programs. Innovations such as digital skilling in agriculture livelihoods and entrepreneurship, financial inclusion and digital economy through public sector banks are deployed to mitigate risks in farming and to sustain their livelihoods. 

Farmers Producer Companies (FPCs)

IDF is promoting FPCs of small and marginal farmers to access technologies, inputs and fair trade. This is contributing to enhancement of income through promotion of;

- Sustainable agriculture technologies to lessen the dependence on external inputs and higher use of locally available resources
- Financial inclusion through credit linkage with state owned Banks
- Supply of agriculture and livestock inputs at competitive rates
- Aggregated marketing of farm produce and research on value addition (both B2B and B2C)
- Use of digital technology to access market rates, marketing avenues and a whole range of other farming related data
- Till March 2020, IDF has incorporated fourteen such FPCs across Karnataka state.



"SUSTHIRA" - Promotion of Sustainable Agriculture

In partnership with SUPRAJA Foundation, IDF has promoted sustainable agriculture and Farmer Producers Companies among small and marginal farm families of Raybag taluk (Belagavi district) and, Tumkur and Gubbi taluks (Tumkur district). Initiated in 2017, the program has succeeded in promoting sustainable agriculture through digital skilling, participatory technology development and mobilization of shareholders for FPCs which have become robust business entities through this partnership. Three taluks together, a total of 24,145 families were covered under this program promoting sustainable agriculture and livestock practices, entrepreneurship development for income enhancement and ecosystem services through seven FPCs.


Kaikraft (Dharwad Kasuti)

Initiated in 2010, Kaikraft is a program by IDF reviving the fast vanishing traditional art of hand embroidery, native to Dharwad district. By upgrading the skills of the artisans and expansion to neighbouring districts of Belagavi and Gadag, it is generating regular employment to over 300 artisans, generating sustained income to these families through production of value added Kasuti products and developing the market brand. Grassroots work has been completed and partnership with NABARD is being explored to build and develop Off-farm Producers Company of Kasuti artisans to graduate this initiative into a self-sustaining business entity.

Natural Fibre Cluster Development

The Natural Fibre Craft Society (with the support of Gramya Turnkey Services Private Ltd.), one of the earliest CBOs promoted by IDF, continues to facilitate production of fibre products (from Banana, Hibiscus, River Grass, Wool) and create market access for these eco-friendly products. It is sustaining the livelihoods of more than 200 poor families of women in Hiriyur taluk, Chitradurga district.


